45. How should a person prepare to receive Holy Communion? What should one do after receiving?
46. How long is one required to fast before receiving Communion? Is it okay to chew gum in church?
47. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church article 1303, what are the 5 *effects of Confirmation*?

48. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church article 1289, what do Eastern churches call the sacrament of Confirmation?
49. According to the Catechism, how is the sacrament of Confirmation conferred?
50. What is *chrism* and why is it an important part of Confirmation?
51. Under what conditions may a priest refuse the sacrament of matrimony to a couple?
52. Who can be a witness at a Catholic wedding? Can a Catholic be a witness in a non-Catholic wedding?
53. What is a marriage annulment? Under what conditions does the church grant an annulment?
54. How is divorce different from an annulment? What is the Catholic position on divorce and remarriage?
55. What are the three vows taken by religious men and women? What does each vow mean?
56. What are the four cardinal virtues?

57. What are the three theological virtues?
58. What are the two "great commandments" that contain the whole law of God? (See Mark 12:28-31)?
59. What is the original meaning of the word catholic? What must we as a church do to live up to that word?
60. Name the four Mysteries of the rosary?
61. Where do you find the letters INRI? What do they stand for?
62. Contact a member of one of the parish's committee's (Pastoral Council, Finance, Education, etc...) and report on what they do and how the committee helps the parish. For example, how often do they meet? What does the agenda of a typical meeting look like? What kind of decisions do they make? What made the individual decide to volunteer to serve on that particular committee?
