Level IV Behaviors & Consequences

Level IV Consequences

- Parent conference
- Student Hearing
- 1 – 10 days out-of-school suspension & possible referral for long-term expulsion
- Suspension or expulsion as mandated by law
- Loss of extra-curricular privileges for 30 days to 1 year

Student Responsibilities

1. Don't Violate any Rules!!
2. Try to Resolve Peer Conflict on your own
Ask someone to stop
Remove yourself from the situation
Tell a staff member or parent
3. Request to have a staff member fill out an Incident Form
4. Be Honest!

Teacher/Staff Responsibilities

1. Don't Allow Students to Violate Rules – anywhere in the school (classroom, hallways, cafeteria, playground, bathrooms, etc.)
2. Complete an Incident Form for ALL Behavior Violations
3. **Be Consistent!**

Principal Responsibilities

1. Same as teacher and staff responsibilities
2. Investigate Incident
3. **Enforce consequences**

Parent Responsibilities

1. Listen to your children
2. But don't always assume they know the whole story
3. Encourage your child to tell a staff member & give them time to do that
4. Check to make sure your child has told an adult at school about the incident
