A Lenten Season that Heals

St. Teresa of Avila once said that our soul is like a beautiful crystal that shines when light hits it. But sin is like tar over the crystal, blocking out the light of Christ. It's in confession that the tar gets removed so that the light can shine again. What has happened in our day that so many have abandoned the practice of confession? Sociologists, bishops, psychologists have offered many reason for the decline: a loss of our sense of sin, a growing shortage of priests, and other blame the changes of Vatican II. I have heard many say, "Why do I need to talk to the priest? I just go directly to Jesus." Although it is true that we can and should have regular encounters with Jesus and ask for Him to forgive us – we conveniently ignore the fact that Jesus gave His church the power to forgive sins. She alone can absolve us from mortal sin. Not only that, AA, psychologists and countless groups point out the necessity to admit our wrong doing to another and the benefits of receiving counsel and direction. And most of all, and I think this is the real reason we have seen a decline in confession in the last several decades, is our rebellious hearts and the loss of the sense that our sinfulness is not simply a private affair, but affects the whole community. People have rejected community in this self-centered and independent-focused culture. We have forgotten that as Christians we are a community of the saved, not just individuals on our own journey. Make time this Lent for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Encounter the fullness of what Jesus meant each of us to experience. **Fr. Dennis**

FOCUS Mission Trips

Only 30 percent of Americans who were raised Catholic are still practicing. 80 percent of those who leave, do so by the age of 23. The fastest growing religious demographic are those who list their faith as "unaffiliated." FOCUS is an organization on college campuses which seeks to reach out to college students to help them develop a relationship with Christ. There are presently 550 FOCUS missionaries. FO-CUS is presently on 125 campuses throughout the United States. FOCUS missionaries on university campuses have over 18,500 Bible studies participants. Over 20,000 young people, now young adults are alumni of the FOCUS ministry. The FOCUS ministry is doing a much needed and incredible work among our college youth.

Last weekend you heard Carissa and Gabby share about their mission work. I want to thank you for your generosity in supporting our young people with their mission trips. Carissa Campbell will be leaving this March break for Rome to join the FOCUS missionaries in evangelizing young people and international visitors in the Holy City. 


This week I have asked Hannah Vincent to share with us. God Bless, **Fr Dennis**

An invitation. That's what a retreat is to me and whenever I sign up for one, a main thought to cross my mind is I hope others will take advantage of this opportunity. Growing up a Catholic homeschooler my faith was always a part of my life, but I didn't attend a retreat until the middle of high school (the well-known summer retreats at

Steubenville), and ever since then I jump at the chance to attend as many as possible. Although an initial response to a retreat is the fear of discomfort. I have never been on a retreat where I was forced to do something or be uncomfortable. God doesn't want you to be uncomfortable in your relationship with Him, but He wants to challenge you to become the person you were created to be. I'll admit it's not easy. At some retreats I can't seem to stop crying and pouring out my heart and at others I simply sense a calm and reassurance God does have His hand in my life and He will guide me. In my experience at the adult retreat with MHT, nothing but peace and a deeply rooted confirmation flooded my soul telling me I was living in God's love. At that particular point in my life I was having a rough time trusting in God's plan. I couldn't understand why I was stuck in a job I detested or why I couldn't find a way out. At one point though, it hit me: trusting God is the greatest adventure of all. He knows more about my life than I will ever know, and He gives us trials to make us stronger. There's a reason for everything, especially our trials. A retreat can be a fantastic step in your relationship with God and nothing bad will come out of it. Only good will happen and if you choose to open your heart and be vulnerable, your life will start to change for the better. I know that sometimes retreats can come at inopportune times, but trust that God will take care of your needs while on the retreat and afterwards. Matthew 6:26 says this plainly, "Look at the birds of the air, for they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns; yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they?" If you have fears about what you might discover about yourself while on a retreat or if you're worried about what you will come back to after the retreat, God will take care of you. He loves you and constantly pursues you, and all you have the do is say "yes".


Fowler Fire & Rescue Breakfast

The Catholic Diocese of Lansing is moving forward on a historic journey to raise \$65 million in its first-ever comprehensive diocesan-wide campaign titled Witness to Hope. Based on the vision of Bishop Boyea's pastoral letter Go and Announce the Gospel of the Lord, this campaign will advance the ability of our parishes, as well as our diocese, to fulfill the shared mission given to us by Jesus for years to come. The money collected over the 5 years (your pledge can be given over a 5 year period) will go into an endowment – only the interest will be used – much like our Educational Trust Fund here at Most Holy Trinity. That way, this collection will provide our Diocese with resources for the future, not just for a one time use. Some of the ways that the Diocese will use the money are listed below.

Please pray and ask the Holy Spirit what you can give. Instead of being overwhelmed by amounts, look at it this way: A pledge of \$10.00 each month for the next 5 years would equal \$600.00. \$20.00 each month for 5 years would equal \$1,200.00. The amounts seem large at first, but when we break down the numbers, our parish goal of \$669.320.00 doesn't seem so daunting. If we all contribute, then our goal will be attainable.


