### *From the Pastor's Desk*

#### The Eucharist The Entire Treasure of the Church

One of the things that I like best about this time of year is the 2<sup>nd</sup> graders who receive their First Holy Communion. Their seriousness, their nervousness, their reverence, and all the things that the children share with me. Just the other day, one of the parents shared with me that their child who received their First Communion a few weeks ago is now counting down "This is my third communion, this is my fourth communion," and so on. How delightful and a good reminder to the rest of us who sometimes take it for granted that this is a most precious gift to us, the Eucharist.

Whenever our young people make their First Holy Communion, I always ask them to write to me and tell me "why" they want to make their First Communion? Their answers range from: "I want to grow closer to Jesus," and "I know it looks like just bread and wine, but I know it's the Body and Blood of Jesus," and "I want to share the Good News of Jesus," and "I know it will help me make more room in my heart for Him," to "Jesus will be inside of me in a new way."

I remember one year one of the girls wrote down not only a nice reflection of why she wanted to receive Christ in Holy Communion, but she also admitted that "she was excited that she was going to get all dressed up!" Every year I hear everything from the theologically profound to the fashion conscious.

But you know all this reminds us that the Eucharist is as St. John Paul II wrote; "the Eucharist is the entire treasury of the Church." Why did he say that? Well, first of all, it's because the Eucharist is Jesus, the Risen Lord, Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. That's why we call it the "Real Presence." It's not just a symbol as some believe. It's really Him. It's the miracle of His Divine presence in the Church. The Eucharist contains every treasure, every gift, every grace within it. Just think about the actual celebration of Mass. It contains everything we need for our salvation. The Word of God proclaimed to us, the Gift of the Spirit, the people of Christ gathered in prayer, worship in Spirit and in Truth, and His Body and Blood which Jesus promised and gave to us at the Last Supper.

Now we might be tempted to say, well Father, not everyone who comes to Mass experiences these things. True. But let's take a closer look at this question. Why does this happen? As a priest for 26 years, I can share some insights as to why this happens.

**1. Because we don't prepare for Mass.** Unlike our culture which encourages passivity and entertainment, as a Christian, there is a definite discipline to our lives. Regarding Mass, we've got to make it a priority. Jesus promises graces to those who are faithful, the greatest grace being, eternal life. Sometimes God is just wanting to know are we going to be faithful? As I tell young people who share with me that their parents can't be bothered to go to Mass, then find a friend and go together.

Are we praying daily? Are we reading the readings of Mass sometime before the weekend to open our hearts to His Word. Do we come a little early so that we can pray and prepare ourselves? Do I ever think about staying for a few minutes to pray in thanksgiving for the gift of the Mass, my life, all that the Lord has given me? Am I perpetually in a rush because I'm not really keeping holy the Sabbath?

**2. My attitude in coming to Mass.** Is it a joy and privilege, or a burden and "something" I have to do? So I approach the holy mysteries already with a closed heart and a bad attitude. Is Mass the center of my weekend? Do I realize that the Mass provides me with every grace and blessing I need, because it's Jesus' Word and His Body and Blood I receive? Do I know that I could be healed at the Mass? Or is my attitude blocking a deeper faith and a heart ready to receive His graces?

**3. There are so many "distractions" Father.** I remember years ago a parent who was very discouraged came to me and didn't know what to do with her children. She told me that their fidgeting and so on... made it impossible to hear everything and so many parts of the Mass she missed because the kids were so distracting. I'm not going to go on about kids in church, true, there are times when the kids need to be taken out because they are a distraction – I don't think it's respectful when kids are screaming in church and the parents just sit there – but there are other times when kids are just kids, they fidget and fuss and we may miss

part of the homily or Mass.

However, this parent was so discouraged that she was thinking about not coming back to Mass any more. I told her, "No... don't do that. Yes, you may miss part of the Mass, and you may not feel very holy after Mass is done, in fact you may feel very tired and frustrated at times.... but don't give up. What you're doing matters. You may not feel it or realize it, but the fact that you bring them to church speaks volumes to them. You have no idea what the Lord is doing in them, even during the times when they don't seem to be paying attention or getting it... Persevere and in time you will see the fruits of your hard work." Several years passed and I was stationed in a different parish, but I was invited back to the parish for an anniversary celebration. This same parent was there, and approached me. She shared with me that she remembered what I had said to her and that in fact, her children now were different and better, and participating in the life of the parish, and she thanked me.

God's grace – the mystery of our lives in Christ. Sometimes we have no idea what God is doing in us and our children.

**3. Sin.** Sometimes it's that simple... people are in a state of mortal sin, they haven't gone to confession in a long time. They are filled with hatred, jealousy, they're gossiping about their neighbor, using inappropriate language, involved in immoral things.... Sin created a barrier between us and God. Maybe it's time to go back to confession and receive the sacramental power of forgiveness.

***"Let a man examine himself, and so eat of the bread and drink of the cup. For any one who eats and drinks without discerning the body eats and drinks judgment upon himself."***  
**1 Corinthians 11:28-29**

**4. Have we given over our lives to God?** Have we made that surrender and begun to make the changes in our lives we need to? We're not going to enter heaven because we're "good people." The Church and the Scriptures makes that clear. We don't enter heaven because we've behaved ourselves... or we're nice people. We enter heaven because Jesus died on the cross for us and rose again, and we have responded to that gift by surrendering our lives to Jesus. There are so many people, even Christians who are under the deception that they deserve to go to heaven, or they've earned it....wrong, wrong, wrong... Listen to the words of St. Paul:

***"For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith, and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God."***  
**(Ephesians 2:8)**

**The Effects of Receiving Holy Communion**

I don't want to end this reflection here, but to remind us of the beautiful effects of Holy Communion. Since the earliest times, the benefits of receiving the Body and Blood of Christ were spelled out to encourage frequent, even daily Holy Communion.

St. John in his 6<sup>th</sup> chapter devoted to the Eucharist, tells us that Jesus proclaims to His followers:

***"I tell you most solemnly, if you do not eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you will not have life in you. Anyone who does eat my flesh and drink my blood has eternal life and I shall raise him up on the last day. For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink. He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me and I live in Him. As I, who am sent by the living Father, myself draw life from the Father, so whoever***

***eats me will draw life from me. This is the bread come down from heaven; not like the bread our ancestors ate. They are dead, but anyone who eats this bread will live forever."*** (John 6: 53-58)

***Jesus promises us life through the worthy reception of the Eucharist.*** There are so many opportunities for us where we can receive grace and supernatural gifts from the Lord. How many young people I have known through the years who have received their vocation through spending time with our Lord in adoration? How many of the faithful have received consolations and graces by being faithful to our Lord, who come Sunday after Sunday to receive His Body and Blood. Holy Communion must be received to support and nourish the supernatural life of the soul. So, too, the church officially teaches that ***"Every effect which bodily food and bodily drink produce in our corporeal life, by preserving this life, increasing this life, healing this life, and satisfying this life - is also produced by this Sacrament in the spiritual life"*** (Council of Florence,1439).

**Holy Communion preserves the supernatural life of the soul by giving the communicant supernatural strength to resist temptation.** It reinforces the ability of our free will to withstand the assaults of the devil. In a formal definition, the Church calls Holy Communion **"an antidote by which we are preserved from grievous sins"** (Council of Trent, 1551).

**Holy Communion cures the spiritual diseases of the soul by cleansing it of venial sins and the temporal punishment due to sin.** No less than serving as an antidote to protect the soul from mortal sins, Communion is **"an antidote by which we are freed from our daily venial sins"** (Council of Trent,1551). As we strive to live in love and true charity the Christian life, the love of God awakens in us new and powerful graces, and this is intensified by the reception of the Eucharist.

**Holy Communion gives us a spiritual joy** in the service of Christ, in defending His cause, in living out our vocations, and in making the sacrifices required of us in imitating the life of our Savior.

On Christ's own promise, **Holy Communion is a pledge of heavenly glory and of our bodily resurrection from the dead (John 6:55).** St. Irenaeus (+ 202 AD) simply declared that, **"when our bodies partake of the Eucharist, they are no longer corruptible as they have the hope of eternal resurrection"** (Against the Heresies, IV, 18,5).

What a privilege it is to be able to receive the Body and Blood of Jesus! How many graces are available to us through the Eucharist. **"Of all devotions, the Blessed Sacrament is the greatest, the one dearest to God and the one most helpful to us."** St. Alphonsus Liguori


