

How a “Regular Guy” Becomes a Deacon

Hello Most Holy Trinity. Some of you have seen me around the parish or at Mass already or read my periodic bulletin column, but I thought you might like to know a bit about me because I will be helping at MHT for the foreseeable future. I hope you don't hold it against me, but I am a big-city boy, having grown up in Detroit. On the flip side, however, I did marry a good Catholic woman from Hubbardston almost 42 years ago. We have five children (four married) and have 12 grandchildren, with one on the way. We have lived in St. Johns since 1993 and I have been a deacon at St. Joseph Parish for three years. Here's how that came about.

The Call: Did you ever get a call that you didn't expect? You know the type that kind of left you confused, wondering if it was intended for you or not. That's a lot like it was for me in the Spring of 2013. I had been looking for more in my faith, but could never get enough. I felt like a sponge that couldn't be spiritually saturated. I was asked if I had ever considered the diaconate and, though I had doubts the diocese would accept me at age 61, I started discerning.

For weeks on end, I repeatedly read and contemplated Jesus' words "those who have ears to hear ought to hear." But I heard nothing until Jesus asked me this question: "Can you cut that last tether preventing you from giving yourself totally to me?" When I answered "Yes," I was on my way to ordination in May, 2019. Eric, the regular guy in the pew, became Deacon Eric.

The Ministry: The call to the diaconate is a call to serve the Lord at the altar and also a call to community. At Most Holy Trinity, I will help Fr. Eric Weber in both areas, with a primary focus on funerals and the sacraments of Baptism and Marriage. If other areas develop where I can be of help, I will do so. But please understand this: I am here to help. Fr. Eric, Fr. Peter and new Parish Administrator Jordan Spitzley have a mountain of work. I'm here to help them and the parish as a whole wherever I can.

I feel quite humbled that the Lord chose me to serve him as a deacon late in my life. The graces and consolations he has afforded me in this ministry have been amazing, even in this short three-year period. I strongly urge anyone even remotely considering the diaconate to pray on it. I am willing to discuss it with anyone who may be interested. It takes time and effort, but the rewards are priceless.

K-12 Religious Education Registration is well underway: This year we are excited to add Kindergarten to First-Eighth Religious Education. Like 1st - 8th, they will have release time from the public school one time during the week. A schedule for the year is in the process of being completed. The start dates/times for the 2022/23 Religious Education year are as follows:

9th-12th High School Youth

Mondays beginning September 26 7:15pm - 8:30pm (We will be returning to a Monday night weekly format)

K-8th Grade

Release time from the public school will begin the week of September 26

Discern the Call to Echo Down the Joy of the Gospel:

Catechists are needed to serve in our K-8th Religious Education program. Students will have release time from the public school one time during the week. In the Gospel, Jesus said, "Go, therefore and make disciples of all nations" (Mt. 28:19). In serving as a catechist, you will have the opportunity to respond to our Lord's call by helping our children come to know God and follow Him in their lives. As you nurture the faith of our young people, you will learn and grow as well. As one long-time catechist put it, "I learn and grow in faith from the children!" We provide you with training, materials, and support. Will you say, "Yes?" Please pray and discern. As you do so, please keep in mind the words of Bishop Baron when he says, "We've been invited to work in the vineyard of the Lord. That is the greatest privilege imaginable, to participate in the Lord's work of saving the world." For more information, please contact the Religious Education office.

WORLD YOUTH DAY 2023

World Youth Day is an enormously grace-filled event. It features quite a number of amazing events but always concludes with an outdoor vigil where all the participants gather together. They spend the night at the place of the vigil and the next morning attend Mass celebrated by the Pope. World Youth Day in 2023 will take place in Lisbon, Portugal from August 1st through the 6th. This location allows participants to visit Fatima where Mother Mary appeared to the three shepherd children in 1917 and where occurred the great miracle of the sun dancing in the sky. WYD is open to those aged 18-35 at the time of the pilgrimage. It does require a level of physical fitness as pilgrims walk a number of miles every day, usually in large crowds, and sometimes while carrying all their belongings with them. We have a good number of young people from St. Mary’s planning to attend and would like to open up the opportunity to MHT parishioners as well.
