## From The Pastor's Desk

#### Thank You

A big thank you to all who supported this year's Diocesan Services Appeal! We have reached our goal, which is great! As of this writing, only about 21% of parish families contributed to the DSA, so hopefully more of us can contribute to this worthy appeal in the future. If you are not in a place where you are able to give treasure to God, please consider giving of your time and talent—we always need more helping hands (especially at our parish festival)! Such stewardship of time and talent was on display on Monday morning at our cemetery. Thanks to all of you who helped with the cemetery spring cleanup! It looks great out there! We are blessed to have such a peaceful place for the mortal remains of our loved ones.

#### Welcoming them back

Last Sunday, I mentioned in my homily that our parish is only <sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub> the size it was roughly 20 years ago, in terms of Mass attendance. If you are curious, our October 2023 average mass count was 826. In 2005, that same count was 1,267–a loss of 441 souls. I mention this to help us realize how important it is that all of us take very seriously our call to be witnesses to our faith in the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. We can't force anyone to believe, but we can pray and live in such a way that draws others to want to know the reasons for our hope.

Sometimes, those who were not raised Catholic are intimidated by the Mass-they don't know our responses or gesture-and feel out of place. If you have a friend or relative who is curious about the faith but not ready for Mass, please consider inviting them to one of our Holy Spirit Encounters! The next encounter is this Sunday, April 14 at 6:30pm.

#### Vocations

With Randy Koenigsknecht and Josh Luttig about to be ordained deacons, our parish will soon be without any seminarians, which is a call for us to redouble our prayers for vocations! As a reminder, our Holy Hour each Wednesday at 5pm is offered for vocations. As one small way to encourage vocations, you will soon notice our altar servers will look a little different. We discovered a box full of cassocks and surplices, that the boys will now be wearing. The girls will be adding small scapulars to their albs–a scapular is often part of the religious habit. Altar serving is an important way for our young people to grow both in their love for the Eucharist, as well as in hearts ready and willing to serve the Lord, wherever He calls them.
